Description:

Regular preschool students are not required to do homework unless they miss concepts on their in-class and school wide tests, but a sheet with all concepts learned each week will be included in their binder. If you would like to work with your child on these concepts, they will benefit from extra time spent with their parents, and will have a better chance at mastering them.

Advanced Preschool and Regular Kindergarten students will not be required to do homework until Lesson 84. **Starting Lesson 84**, your child will be assigned reading homework two days a week unless there is no school the next day. Students should read to their parents. Parents should indicate the number of pages read on homework chart on the back cover of the reading book. The amount read is up to the parents. It should be enough to give the students regular practice and to keep them up with others in their Reading Circle. Teachers will check the homework charts the next day. This early training in homework is an important beginning in teaching these young children to be responsible for something on their own. They will be excited about the opportunity to read to their parents and to have homework as older children do.

Advanced Kindergarten students will not be required to do homework until Lesson 54. **Starting Lesson 54**, your child will be assigned reading homework two days a week unless there is no school the next day. Students should read to their parents. Parents should indicate the number of pages read on homework chart on the back cover of the reading book. The amount read is up to the parents. It should be enough to give the students regular practice and to keep them up with others in their Reading Circle. Teachers will check the homework charts the next day. This early training in homework is an important beginning in teaching these young children to be responsible for something on their own. They will be excited about the opportunity to read to their parents and to have homework as older children do.

Excel Kindergarten students will not be required to do homework until Lesson 13. **Starting Lesson 13**, your child will be assigned reading homework 5 days a week unless there is no school the next day. Students should read two times to themselves and once to their parent. The pages that are required to be read are indicated on their homework sheet. **Starting Lesson 19**, your child will be assigned spelling homework 5 days a week unless there is no school the next day. Follow the instructions on the homework sheet.
